



## Why study the Kabataang Pinoy?

- Youth is the period of transition from childhood to adulthood

## **Research Design**


YAFS5 employed a two-stage sampling design:

- 1st stage: 974 sample barangays selected using systematic sampling
- 2<sup>nd</sup> stage: in every sample barangay, the field team **interviewed a target** of 15 households, systematically-selected
